PUBLIC HEALTH IN CARROLL COUNTY

C3PH Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) Priorities

C3PH, with the help of the Public Health Advisory Council, which is composed of the Carroll County Roundtable and PHAC Leadership Team, identifies regional public health priorities based on assessments of community health and encourages the development of evidence-based programs, practices and policies so as to advance the coordination of services among community partners and promotion of community engagement on public health issues. C3PH welcomes volunteers to participate in all CHIP priorities:

Early Childhood and Early Parenting Support

Ensure all children enter kindergarten healthy and ready to learn and thrive by 2020.

Substance Misuse and Addiction

Prevent and reduce substance misuse (including alcohol, marijuana and prescription drugs) among all generations.

Aging with Connection and Purpose

Improve the preparation, connection, and purpose experienced by older residents by teaching skills to prevent injury and improve life planning conversations with their families and caregivers.

Access to Comprehensive Behavioral Health Services

Improve access to a comprehensive, coordinated continuum of behavioral healthcare services in Carroll County in 2020.

Emergency Preparedness Across the Lifespan

Increase community and individual preparedness and ensure that all residents have access to mental health services.

Chronic Disease

Reduce the disease incidence and prevalence in regards to chronic health conditions including cancer, heart disease, diabetes, hypertension, asthma and obesity.

In addition to these community health priorities, C3PH is also responsible for the following programs:

Citizen Corps

A national network of local volunteers whose mission is to harness the power of every individual through education, training, and volunteer service to make communities safer, stronger, and better prepared to respond to the threats of terrorism, crime, public health issues, and disasters of all kinds.

School-Based Influenza Vaccination Services

C3PH partners with local schools to offer no-cost influenza vaccinations to students. This program prioritizes schools where children are less likely to be insured or have other barriers to being vaccinated.
